Ellis, Student Enrollment Counselor, The University of Akron, School of Nursing, Akron, OH, 44325-3701. Student copies are fine, but you will need to request official transcripts when you apply to the University. It is not necessary to include course descriptions for coursework completed at The University of Akron. We will review and respond with a planning sheet that will indicate which courses can be transferred and how many (if any) of the prerequisites you have left to complete.

If you prefer to apply by mail, contact the Office of Admissions at (330) 972-7101 for an application. If you are an International student, please contact the Office of International Programs at (330) 972-6493 for admission. If you have attended The University of Akron in the past, you may need to reactivate your file by contacting the Office of Admissions at (330) 972-7101.

The application deadline, including transcripts, course descriptions, and other required materials for classes beginning each May is December 1st.
