BACHELOR OF FINE ARTS | BFA

A BFA is a focused program that prepares you for a professional career in the visual arts or for graduate school. This degree is offered in these major areas:

- Printmaking

BACHELOR OF ARTS IN STUDIO ART | BA

This degree includes coursework from multiple disciplines. Curriculum requirements include 42+ credits in studio art, cultural history, liberal arts and humanities; the option to pursue a minor; and two years of a foreign language or five courses in American Sign Language.

BACHELOR OF ARTS IN ART EDUCATION | BA

This degree program prepares you to become a future educator, professional decision-maker and leader in the field of art education. The degree leads to P, K-12 Visual Arts licensure.
