The audience will be challenged to consider what it means to be an ethical person when conducting sensitive research with communities different from one's own.

Joseph E. Trimble retired in June 2020 after more than 5 decades of teaching and research. Throughout his career, he focused on promoting



psychological and sociocultural research with Indigenous populations, especially American Indians and Alaska Natives. He also conducted research on the influence of cultural diversity leadership styles and practices. Dr. Trimble has presented over 200 papers and invited addresses and generated over 160 publications. He has received many awards, including the Gold Medal Award for Lifetime Achievement in Psychology in the Public Interest from the American Psychological Foundation. In 2019, he received the Distinguished Alumni Award from the College of Arts and Sciences at the University of Oklahoma.
