The following information has official approval of the BCAS LeBron James Family Foundation (LBJFF) School of Education; it is intended only as a supplemental guide. Official degree requirements are established at the time of admission to the School. Completion of this degree within the identified time frame below is contingent upon many factors, including but not limited to: class availability, total number of required credits, work schedule, finances, family, course drops/withdrawals, successfully passing courses, prerequisites, among others. The transfer process is completed through an appointment with your Academic Advisor.

Preadmission Courses – Completion of these courses () is required for admission into the School of Education. A minimum 2.5 GPA is required in the preadmission coursework and a cumulative GPA of 2.5, including transfer work, is required for admission. Students must be admitted into the School of Education in order to take many of the Professional Education, Literacy Core, and Content Specific courses.

NOTES:

- a. English Comp I (ENGL 111) and English Comp II (ENGL 112) are the recommended classes to the meet the General Education Writing requirement. English (2020:121) can be used to fulfill the English Composition I requirement and Technical Report Writing (ENGL 222) can be used to fulfill the English Composition II requirement. C or higher grade required for admission to the School.
- b. Natural Science Requirement: Seven credits of Natural Science are required for general education and preadmission. One course <u>must</u> include a lab section. While a variety of science courses are offered, 7 credits are required.
- c. Social Science Requirement: 6 credits of Social Science are required for General Education and preadmission. Intro Psychology and Intro Sociology are recommended for this program. Intro Sociology also double dips with Domestic Diversity tag.
- d. Placement for a Math/Stats/Logic course is determined through academic advisor. Eligibility for math courses is determined via placement test score, ACT and/or SAT-R scores, AP scores, or prior college level courses.
- **e.** The Student Teaching experience is considered full time teaching and is to be taken in the last semester of the program. Due to the nature of this experience students are not permitted to take other courses other than what is recommended in the last semester as listed above. Students must apply to student teach the semester prior to student teaching and should see the Director of Student Teaching regarding the experience.  - Students should work with their faculty advisor to decide which Student Teaching Experience they should take.

Course substitutions or waivers may only be approved by the faculty advisor for this program.

FBI/BCI: Certain education courses require BCI and FBI background checks which are used by area schools for placement made during the day. The Ohio Department of Education maintains a list of criminal convictions that disqualify applicants for a state educator license.
