



- Founded in 1870
- Buchtel College trustees transferred the institution and its assets to city of Akron in 1913, name changes to The University of Akron in 1926
- World's first courses in rubber chemistry offered beginning in 1909
- Celebrated 150th anniversary in 2020
- A campus enhancement program in the 2000s resulted in 22 new buildings and 34 acres of new green space added to the now 218-acre campus
- UA is home to 50+ centers and institutes, several nationally known, including the Bliss Institute for Applied Politics, the Cummings Center for the History of Psychology, the Fisher Institute for Professional Selling, and many more.
- UA offers 300 student organizations with opportunities for experiential learning and skills development
