THE CAMEOS OF CARING ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

DESCRIPTION

The University of Akron College of Nursing established the Cameos of Caring Endowed Scholarship in 2002 in conjunction with the nationally known Cameos of Caring program.

Dr. Ellen B. Rudy, former dean of the University of Pittsburgh School of Nursing, created the Cameos of Caring in 1999 to honor “those unsung heroes on the front lines of health care.” One of Rudy’s goals was to use Cameos of Caring as a springboard for recognizing the value of nurses across the country. The University of Akron College of Nursing is the third university nationwide to use the Cameos of Caring event as a strategic approach in addressing the nursing shortage.

The Cameos of Caring Endowed Scholarship is awarded annually to non-nurse students entering the College of Nursing, students beginning the RN to BSN sequence, or students beginning the LPN to BSN sequence.

Scholarship candidates will be evaluated based on the Cameos of Caring criteria. Thus, candidates must display significant potential in demonstrated excellence in patient care, ability to effectively serve as an advocate for patients and their families, and act as an exemplary role model for the nursing profession. The College of Nursing Cameos of Caring Committee members and a College of Nursing Advisory Board select the scholarship recipients. Scholarships are renewable to recipients who actively depict the Cameos of Caring criterion and maintain a 3.0 cumulative grade point average.

FUNDING ARRANGEMENTS

The Cameos of Caring Endowed Scholarship is funded in part by the proceeds of the annual Cameos of Caring awards dinner. Additional contributions to fund are encouraged and welcomed.

Founded in 1967, The College of Nursing, now The School of Nursing under the College of Health Professions, as of July 1, 2012 offers multiple educational programs designed to meet the needs of both students aspiring to become professional nurses and practicing professional nurses seeking career advancement.

Located on the campus in Mary Gladwin Hall, the School offers the basic baccalaureate program (B.S.N.), an RN/B.S.N. sequence for registered nurse graduates of associate degree and diploma programs, Accelerated Option for BSN, an LPN/B.S.N. sequence for licensed practical nurses aspiring to become registered nurses, the Master of Science in Nursing (M.S.N.) degree, and the RN/M.S.N. sequence for registered nurse graduates of associate degree and diploma programs who meet graduate standards.

The University of Akron School of Nursing is fully accredited by the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE) offering degrees at the baccalaureate, masters and doctoral levels. The prelicensure BSN Program is approved by the Ohio Board of Nursing. The Nurse Anesthesia Program is the largest in the state of Ohio and is accredited by the Council on Accreditation of Nurse Anesthesia Educational Programs.
