Leadership Exploration and Development Participant Requirements 2018-2019

LEAD 1.0 is intended for students, usually transitioning from freshman year to sophomore year, who are interested in learning about foundational leadership theories in order to seek more advanced roles on campus or within the local community.

- Submit an application for membership via a form on OrgSync**
- Active membership in at least one registered student organization on campus**
- Attend one of the Meet & Greet Sessions at the beginning of the fall 2018 semester**

- Attend LEAD Cohort Gatherings**
 - Group Gatherings: 11 gatherings
 - Monday's from 5:00pm-6:30pm

 - Spring: January 28, February 11 & 25, March 11, April 1 & 15
 - Complete all projects associated with the gatherings including: community service hours, individual reflection, campus program attendance, resume creation/update.

 - Fulfill a total of 30 service hours by April 5, 2019
- Coaching/Mentoring**
 - Meet with your assigned LEAD 2.0 member, recurrence to be determined

What are the Group Gatherings?

Group Gatherings are bi-weekly gatherings of your cohort. They run for 1.5 hours and will continue throughout the academic year, beginning in September and ending in April. There are various projects and tasks that will be completed throughout the year and in order to graduate from the LEAD, each member must complete all requirements. **Attending LEAD gatherings is crucial to your success in the program!**

What do I receive after graduating from the LEAD?

All graduates will receive a certificate of completion as well as cords to wear during graduation.
